The ABS undertakes collection of statistics throughout Australia and compiles the statistics in its central office in Canberra and regional offices located in the eight state and territory capitals. In addition to the national statistical responsibilities, regional offices also have primary responsibility for the delivery of statistical services to their state or territory. In Western Australia and Tasmania, the Regional Director administering the ABS regional office is also the State Government Statistician.

The ABS provides a range of information solutions for customers, including self-serve statistics accessible through the ABS website, a national information and referral telephone service, user-pays information consultancies and support for the complex needs of researchers through streamlined access to, and use of, microdata. The ABS is also supporting a national approach to improving statistical literacy and capability across the Australian population.
