# Senator BUSHBY asked:

- 1807. How much was spent on printing 2011-12? Of this amount, how much was for printing documents?
- 1808. How many documents (include the amount of copies) were printed in 2011-12? How many of these printed documents were also published online?
- 1809. Of the documents that were printed in 2011-12, where were they delivered and what was the cost?
- 1810. How much has been spent on printing this financial year to date (26 October 2012)? Of this amount, how much was for printing documents?
- 1811. How many documents (include the amount of copies) have been printed this financial year to date (26 October 2012)? How many of these printed documents were also published online?

#### Answer:

- 1807. The Australian Prudential Regulation Authority (APRA) spent \$88,594.47 on printing during 2011-12. Of this amount, \$30,207 related to external publications. All figures are GST exclusive.
- 1808. During 2011-12, APRA printed:
  - 1400 copies of the APRA Annual Report 2010-11;
  - 800 copies of APRA Insight Issue 2 2011; and
  - 800 copies of APRA *Insight* Issue 1 2012.

These documents are also available on APRA's website.

- 1809. Documents were delivered to subscribers via Australia Post. Remaining copies were delivered to APRA's office at 400 George Street Sydney. The cost of delivery was approximately \$7,700 (GST exclusive).
- 1810. Printing expenditure for this financial year to date (26 October 2012) is \$63,043.30. Of this amount, \$31,038.60 related to external publications. All figures are GST exclusive.
