Senator BUSHBY asked:

847. Has the department/agency purchased coffee machines for staff useage?

If yes, provide a list that includes the type of coffee machine, the cost, the amount, and any ongoing costs such as purchase of coffee or coffee pods and when the machine was purchased.

- 850. Who is responsible for the maintenance of the coffee machines?
 - a. How much was spent on maintenance in 2011-12 and how much this financial year to date (26 October 2012), include a list of what maintenance has been undertaken.
 - b. Where does the funding for maintenance come from?

Answer:

847. Coffee Machines have been purchased for staff usage and the operating cost to ASIC is estimated at \$4.51 per person per month. Costs, including the initial purchase, are detailed by site in the table below:

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- 848. Coffee machines were purchased to encourage staff interaction across business units within the office environment. Coffee machines are generally located in the central breakout space to promote this interaction. This approach has been employed by a number of other Commonwealth Agencies and is common in the private sector.
- 849. Coffee machines are assets and as such were funded from ASIC's Core Capital funding.
- 850. General maintenance of the machines, including re stocking and cleaning is managed by the local ASIC Property and Business Services team. Breakdown maintenance for machines is provided by the supplier of the machines. In larger offices daily cleaning is absorbed within the Tenancy cleaning contract, this is detailed in the answer to question 847.
 - a. In the FY 2011-2012, ASIC spent \$5,049.00 (ex GST) on maintenance of the coffee machines.
 - This financial year to date (31 October 2012), ASIC has spent \$3,148.16 (ex GST).
 - b. All maintenance costs are funded from ASIC's core operating budget.
