## Notes:

1. The 2013-14 financial year reflects the full financial year. Note following the Machinery of Government (MOG) changes of 18 September 2013 the former Department of Education, Employment and Workplace Relations became the Department of Education and therefore the 2013-14 Annual Report for the Department of Education only reflects part of the financial year.
2. On 23 December 2014, most of former Outcome 1 programmes transferred to the Department of Social Services due to MOG changes. The programmes that remained with the Department of Education and Training are not classified as discretionary grants.
3. On 13 December 2011 and 9 February 2012, as a result of MOG changes these programmes became part of the then Department of Industry, Innovation, Science, Research and Tertiary Education. In September 2013 these programmes became part of the then Department of Education. Some previously reported programmes are not classified as discretionary grants, but have been included in this process for consistency reporting.
4. These programmes were administered by the Department of Industry during the 2011-12 to 2013-14 financial years. They transferred to the Department following MOG changes on 23 December 2014.
5. The AIATISS programme has been excluded from this process because this is not a programme the Department has any discretion as to allocation.
