But it would not have been in the normal way that government would provide a grant in that, once the grant was out of the door in terms of the Aboriginals Benefit Trust Account, it was probably not subject to the same acquittal processes as it would have been if a government grant had been provided. They are slightly different, and perhaps on notice I could provide some of those differences.
