#### **Question:**

- 1. "How many redundancies there had been over the past financial year and this year to date?"
- 2. "Do you separate those out as to whether they are voluntary redundancies or whether they are forced redundancies?"
- 3. "In terms of how many redundancies and the breakdown of those redundancies, could you also come back and let us know how many agencies have had redundancies and who those agencies are?"

#### **Answer:**

The data below and in the Attachments has been provided to the Department of Finance by the Australian Public Service Commission.

- 1. Between 1 July 2012 and 30 June 2013 there have been 2,679 retrenchments across 70 departments and agencies. Between 1 July 2013 and 31 October 2013 there have been approximately 674 retrenchments across 50 departments and agencies. Data from 1 July 2013 to 31 October 2013 (and in Attachment B) are unofficial figures as:
  - a) at 3 December 2013, 15 agencies have not submitted their data up to and including 31 October 2013;
  - b) Machinery of Government moves are still being finalised and manual adjustment is required; and
  - c) the data has not been subjected to the full range of quality assurance and verification checks that are instituted bi-annually.
