# (SE16/069) - Nauru files - incidents - Programme 1.5: IMA Offshore Management

Senator McKim, Nick (L&CA) written:

Who decided which of the incidents revealed in the Nauru files would be referred to the Nauru Police? What was the criteria used to determine what was referred? How many incidents reports have there been on Nauru since the period covered by the Nauru files? Could you provide a breakdown by classification?

### Answer:

Where necessary, matters are referred by the Government of Nauru (GoN) to the Nauru Police Force for investigation and action.

For incidents involving refugees in the Nauruan community, Connect Settlement Services encourages the alleged victim to report the alleged incident to the Nauru Police Force.

According to departmental systems, there have been 2958\* incident reports for Nauru for the period of 29 October 2015 – 30 September 2016, which were classified as follows:

Category	Total
