Senator Fierravanti-Wells asked:

Further to evidence provided by Ms Halton, please provide details in relation to "significant numbers of people were party to these evaluations" including:

- a) Who were the significant number of people? Please provide a list.
- b) What were "these evaluations"?

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Answer:

- a) The Better Access evaluation was widely known about in the mental health sector. The Department of Health and Ageing reiterates the evidence it provided at the hearing on 30 May 2011, including as recorded on page 70 of the Official Hansard, and in answers to several Questions on Notice from the February 2011 hearing in terms of the significant numbers of stakeholder organisations, consumers, service providers and experts included in the evaluation. - b) The Better Access evaluation comprised several component parts, summarised in the following table:
