Senator Heffernan asked:

The National Health and Medical Research C advises that "there is currently no published scientific evidence to positively link Wind Turbines with adverse Health effects" however, the NHMRC also advises "the Public Statement and Report are a form of advice to the community about the current state of published scientific literature on wind turbines and their effect on health. It is important to note that, as evidence reviews, they are not a scientific investigation conducted by NHMRC itself"." Because only a small body of robust scientific evidence currently exists in this field, NHMRC is continuing to monitor the scientific literature"

Can the NHMRC please confirm the titles, authors and sponsors of the "small body of robust scientific evidence it did review?
