Senator Fierravanti-Wells asked:

What existing contracts does the government have with NGOs to provide services under this programme? Please provide details of the organisations with whom the government has existing contractual arrangements and when each of these contracts is due to end.

Answer:

Specifically in terms of telephone counselling services there are two major organisations, Kids Helpline and Lifeline, which have funding agreements in place with the Australian Government to provide telephone counselling services.

The following table provides more information on these contracts:

Lifeline Australia	Telephone counselling services	\$26,475,000	30 June 2012
Kids Help Line	Telephone and web counselling services	\$7,827,400	30 June 2012
