SKM-MMA has been engaged to model energy market scenarios to support the Authority's analysis for the Review of the Renewable Energy Target. Red Pony has been engaged to create document templates to streamline producion of the Authority's reports and presentations.

SKM-MMA commenced work on 27 August 2012 and is due to complete its work by 30 November 2012. The contract totals \$131 780 inclusive of GST. This was a direct source procurement with quotes from four firms with relevant expertise.

Red Pony commenced work on 26 September 2012 and is due to complete its work in November 2012. The contract totals \$6270 inclusive of GST and was a direct source procurement.

- 2. As the Authority commenced operations on 1 July 2012, an Annual Procurement Plan has not been published this calendar year. The Authority will assess business requirements and Authority outcomes on as needs basis to determine if consultancy services are required.
