Senator Urquhart asked:

What was the Department's view of the comprehensiveness of the Climate Change Authority's review of the Renewable Energy Target at the end of last year? How did stakeholders feel that process went? One of the recommendations was to move to 4 yearly reviews, why did stakeholders find this important?

Answer:

- 1. The Climate Change Authority (CCA) is a statutory body established by the previous Government. The CCA conducted the 2012 review in accordance with the requirements of the *Renewable Energy (Electricity) Act 2000.*
