In relation to TEQSA's relationship with the Australian Skills Quality Authority (ASQA):

- 1. Has TEQSA signed a memorandum of understanding with ASQA?
- 2. What are the terms of the memorandum of understanding?
- 3. Will the memorandum of understanding be released?
- 4. Are there any matters in which TEQSA and ASQA have not yet agreed?

ANSWER

- 1. Yes, this was signed by both agencies on 12 December 2011.
- 2. The objectives of the memorandum of understanding (MOU) are as follows: 'The parties will work together to develop a coordinated regulatory approach for multi-sector providers with the objectives of:
 - (a) streamlining the regulation of multi-sector providers to the maximum extent possible given different and separate regulatory standards frameworks for the higher education and vocational education and training sectors;
 - (b) reducing the potential for duplication that impacts on the regulatory burden and cost for multi-sector providers; and
 - (c) using a customised regulatory approach that caters for the unique circumstances of each multi-sector provider.'
- 3. A joint communiqué to update the sector on the MOU and its implementation was released in early March and has been posted on both the TEQSA and ASQA websites. http://www.asqa.gov.au/about-asqa/regulatory-approach/asqa--and-teqsa.html and http://www.teqsa.gov.au/news. This contains details of the content of the MOU.
- 4. No. TEQSA and ASQA are working through a range of operational details necessary to implement the commitments outlined in the MOU.
