- 5. What is the total cost of this unit?
- 6. Do members of the unit have access to cabinet documents?
- 7. List the security classification and date the classification was issued for each officer, broken down by APS or SES level, in the red tape reduction unit or similar body.
- 8. What is the formal name given to this unit/taskforce/team/workgroup or agency within the department?

## ANSWER

- 1. A Portfolio Regulation Reform Taskforce has been established. The Taskforce comprises the Business Online Services Branch and the Regulation Reform Policy Branch.

- 2. The Regulation Reform Policy Branch, created specifically to progress the regulation reform agenda across the portfolio, comprised 12.5 officers consisting of 1 APS4, 2 APS5, 2 APS6, 5 EL1, 1 EL2, and 1.5 SES, as of 5 March 2013.
- 3-4. The department has recruited staff from the portfolio through an internal mobility process.
- 5. The total budget of the Regulation Reform Policy Branch for 2013–14 is about \$850,000.
- 6. Yes.
- 7. All of the officers have been issued with at least a minimum baseline (Protected) clearance.
