# SENATE LEGISLATION COMMITTEE - QUESTIONS ON NOTICE 2007-08 ADDITIONAL ESTIMATES HEARING

Senator Stephens provided in writing.

## Question

Child Care Services

The department advised during the hearing that between 2006/07 and 2007/08 there were change in the mix of child care services affecting the budget lines.

For 2006/07 and 2007/08, please identify child care services operated by each of the following, and what percentage of overall services this represents:

- State and Territory Governments
- Local Governments
- Community based organisations
- Private companies

#### **Answer**

The Child Care Services Support Program (CCSSP) funds are split across three items:

- Child Care Services Support Bill 1
- Child Care Services Support (SPP) Bill 2: payments to State and Territory Governments
- Children's Services LGA Bill 2: payments to Local Government Associations.

If a service, eligible for funding under the CCSSP, is provided by a State/Territory Government or local government authority, the funds are paid from the appropriate Bill 2 item. Payments to all other sector types (i.e. private or community based) are paid from the Bill 1 item. Hence, the reduction in the estimates for the Bill 2 items reflected an estimated decrease in those sectors' participation among services eligible for sustainability assistance.

The number and percentage of approved child care services<sup>1</sup>, according to sector, for 2006-07 and 2007-08 (as at 1 February 2008) is as follows:
