Question

GOLDEN GURUS - SMALL BUSINESSES

Have any small businesses approached member organisations to participate in the program? How many and where are they located? How many small businesses have been successful in their application to participate in the program? Have any small businesses been connected with a mentor?

Answer

We are unable to provide these figures.

To be part of Golden Gurus, an organisation needs to demonstrate that they deliver a service that meets the standards set out in the Golden Gurus Quality Guidelines. As Member Organisations do not receive fees (refer SQ10-000688), they are not required to report the number of participants.

There are 14 Member Organisations that connect mature age volunteers to small businesses.

The Department will conduct a survey of Member Organisations as part of monitoring and evaluation for the program, after Member Organisations have had the opportunity to settle into the program.
