Question

Chaplaincy program

"Can you provide a breakdown, including by state and territory, on: How many schools retained chaplains under the new program? How many schools retained the same person but swapped their designation to a Student Welfare Worker? How many schools dropped out of the program completely? "

Answer

Applications for schools to receive funding for a continuation of their existing service closed on 2 March 2012. The final number of continuing schools will not be available until all applications have been assessed and Funding Agreements have been executed between the Commonwealth and the designated Funding Recipient.

At the conclusion of the National School Chaplaincy Program on 31 December 2011, 2,637 schools were receiving funding. Of these, 2,499 schools have been approved to receive ongoing funding under the National School Chaplaincy and Student Welfare Program as at 28 February 2012.

Of the 2,499 approved schools, 2,224 have elected for the option of a chaplain, 207 have elected for a student welfare worker, and 68 have yet to make a choice. A State/Territory breakdown is as follows:
