#### Schools reviews

Senator KIM CARR: I just noticed that the department seems to be running guite a large number of reviews at the moment, is it not? There is a review into indexation. There is a review into language proficiency and low socioeconomic status. How many other reviews do you have at the moment? ..... Senator KIM CARR: So, how many others do you have? Ms Paul: At the moment it would not be that many. I think we would have to take it on notice. ..... Senator KIM CARR: ...... How many reviews do you have currently underway within the department? Ms Paul: For the whole portfolio? Senator KIM CARR: In the schools area. Mr Cook: We will take that on notice. Senator KIM CARR: Could you tell me the dates on which those reviews are to report? Mr Cook: I am happy to do that, noting some of those reviews are actually COAG reviews. Senator KIM CARR: Yes, but there is still quite a heavy workload in regard to the reviews. Mr Cook: But they are not department reviews as such. They are COAG reviews, which is the point I am making. Senator KIM CARR: But who is running them? Mr Cook: It would be state and territory with the Commonwealth. That is how COAG operates in that sense. Senator KIM CARR: If you would not mind telling me the cost of each review. Mr Cook: We can certainly take that on notice. Senator KIM CARR: What departmental support is being provided for those reviews?

#### Answer

Attachment A outlines the three reviews currently underway.

In January 2014, the Hon Christopher Pyne MP wrote to key stakeholders outlining his intention to consult during 2014 on review points of the Schooling Resource Standard model currently outlined in the NERA. These include an indexation review and reviews of Students with Disability, English Language Proficiency and Low Socio-economic Status loadings (table at **Attachment B** refers).
