Senator Carr provided in writing:

What "adjustments to outcome payments" will be available to CDEP organisations offering Job Network-type assistance, as foreshadowed on page 15 of the CDEP discussion paper?

Answer:

Under the Indigenous Employment Centres (IEC) contract for 2005-06, outcome fees have been restructured as an incentive for IECs to place longer term unemployed CDEP participants into employment. The outcome fees are as follows:

| Outcome Fees | | |
|------------------------|---------------------|---------------------|
| Length of Unemployment | 13 Week Outcome Fee | 26 Week Outcome Fee |
| 0-12 months | \$1500 | \$750 |
| 13-24 months | \$1650 | \$825 |
| 25+ months | \$2500 | \$1250 |

In the previous contract for IECs, 13 and 26 week outcome payments were funded at \$1650 and \$825 respectively and duration of unemployment did not affect the level of outcome fee paid.

In addition, those high performing Indigenous Employment Centres who are invited to provide expanded services, as indicated in the CDEP Discussion Paper, will receive \$500 for each participant who commences in the expanded services arrangements.
