Senator Marshall provided in writing:

Can you provide information about average outcomes under AWAs broken down by industry and occupational groupings? Specifically, what are the AWA pay outcomes for unskilled workers in each industry?

Answer:

Yes. ABS data covering AWA earnings is available for sixteen industries and nine occupational groups and are current as at May 2004.

The available data does not classify AWA workers into skilled and unskilled categories for each industry, hence this information cannot be provided. However, occupational groups such as Elementary Clerical, Sales & Service Workers and Labourers & Related Workers are indicative of a lower skills base.
