## **Question:**

Senator Marshall asked in writing:

How many complaints has the department received in the last year regarding the underpayment or non-payment of wages?

Please provide a breakdown of these complaints by: gender, age, occupation, industry, size of business, location (by state) and employment status (full-time, part-time, casual or independent contractor).

Of these complaints, how many involved unpaid monies of:

- (a) less than \$1,000
- (b) between \$1,000 and \$5,000
- (c) between \$5,000 and \$10,000
- (d) over \$10,000

#### Answer:

The Department received 4,933 claims for underpayment or non-payment of wages in the period 1 July 2004 to 31 March 2005. However, no further breakdowns are available.

The only available demographic breakdowns are claims finalised by State/Territory.
