## Question:

- 1. For the Indigenous Tutorial Assistance Scheme, what is the definition of an eligible student?
- 2. Can the Department confirm that every eligible student will receive tutorial assistance?
- 3. If not, what percentage of eligible students will receive tutorial assistance?
- 4. We have heard reports that some schools are only being offered tutorial assistance for 30% of eligible students? Is this true?

## Answer:

Indigenous Tutorial Assistance Scheme

- 1. The Indigenous Tutorial Assistance Scheme (ITAS) comprises five programme elements, each of which define student eligibility for the relevant elements:
  - In-Class Tuition an eligible student is an Indigenous student in Years 4, 6 and 8 who
    did not meet one or more of the Year 3, 5 or 7 literacy or numeracy benchmarks in the
    previous year's literacy and numeracy benchmark tests; or an Indigenous student in
    Years 1 to 8, who is at risk of not meeting the relevant literacy and/or numeracy
    curriculum outcome levels for their age.
  - Year 9, 10, 11 & 12 Tuition an eligible student is an Indigenous secondary school student who is studying to complete Year 9, 10, 11 or 12.
  - Remote Indigenous Students (RIS) Tuition an eligible student is an Indigenous student who leaves their remote community to attend school in a non-remote location, or to attend a remote boarding school. Tuition is available in the first year students are away from their remote community.
  - Vocational Education and Training (VET) Tuition an eligible student is an Indigenous student who is enrolled in a formal VET course or structured training programme leading to the attainment of a Certificate Level III or above qualification. An eligible student can also be one participating in an accredited VET course at an institution receiving ITAS tuition prior to 2005.
  - Tertiary Tuition an eligible student is an Indigenous student studying a university award level course.
