Question

Qualifications of Child Care Workers

Ms Taylor: Yes, but overall it will certainly lift the ability of people to be qualified. That recognition of prior learning is Certificate III diploma and advanced diploma. There are also grants of up to \$1,125 for workers in regional and remote areas to be able to access recognition of prior learning. There are a number of previous initiatives, such as TAFE fee waivers, to encourage people to take up qualifications in the TAFE sector, and that ranges from Certificate III to diploma and advanced diploma. We have some exact numbers on all of the various sectors and the numbers of child-care workers who have a qualification. Those numbers are increasing. If you would like those numbers, I can take that on notice. Senator NASH: That would be really useful.

Answer

Qualifications levels of child care workers by type of service are published in the 2010 National Early Childhood Education and Care Workforce Census report which was released on 29 June 2011.
