#### Question

### Youth Allowance recipients and additional supplement

Senator CASH: How many youth allowance (other) recipients also received the additional supplement of \$20.80 per fortnight as a result of their participation in Work for the Dole, Green Corps, a literacy or numeracy program, or the Community Development Employment Project in 2012-13? Is it possible to provide a breakdown of this program by participation? Mr Emerson: We would have to take that question on notice.

#### Answer

The following table gives a breakdown of the 10 531 Youth Allowance (Other) recipients who also received an additional supplement as a result of their participation in Work for the Dole, Green Corps, a literacy or numeracy program or the Community Development Employment Project for the financial year to March 2013. Some recipients have participated in more than one activity, therefore the total is a count of unique recipients who received the additional supplement.
