# **Child Care Benefit**

Senator BILYK: What would the upper income threshold for the childcare benefit would be for a family with one child in the next financial year? Mr Maynard: The current year's maximum income is \$142,426. Each subsequent year's maximum income limit will be subject to CPI adjustment. I do not think we able to give any forecast as to what the CPI might be two years out. Senator BILYK: Whatever the CPI is, that is it what will advance to, Mr Maynard: That is correct. Senator BILYK: Are there any projections on how families are likely to earn over the upper income threshold? Ms Taylor: Yes, I can give you that. Senator BILYK: Are you able to break that down for me by the income bracket? Ms Taylor: Certainly, Senator. So for the next financial year, 2014, the number of families in total represents 10.6 per cent—that is, 100,079. By income bracket, under income under \$50,000, there will be 1,035 families. Sorry, you were after who was above the cap? Senator BILYK: Yes, but that is alright because this information you are telling me now will help me get to that anyway, won't it? Ms Taylor: We will do the CCB cap. Mr Maynard: Unfortunately, we do not have the CCB cap. We do have a projected grouping of families by \$50,000 ranges, which will not give you what you are looking for. Senator BILYK: If you could take that on notice and get back to me, that would be good. Thank you.

#### Answer

### Child Care Benefit Income Threshold

The upper income threshold for Child Care Benefit for a family with one child for the 2013–14 financial year is \$145 642.
