Has gender wage inequality grown over the life of the government? Please provide calculations on a year to year basis.

Answer:

No. Women's average full-time hourly earnings as a percentage of men's have risen from 86.2 per cent in May 1996 to 89.8 per cent in May 2006.

The table below illustrates the gender earnings ratio for adult full-time hourly earnings for the month of May in all years between 1996 and 2006.
