Relocation scheme for job seekers

a. How many job seekers have been assessed for the relocation scheme that started on 1January 2011? b. How many job seekers have been assessed for relocation? c. How many job seekers have been approved for relocation to date? d. To date, how much has been spent on this program? e. What is the profile of those accessing the scheme (ie. single, families)? f. What occupations will the relocated job seekers be working in? g. Where are jobseekers locating from/to?

Answer

(a ,b)The Department collects data on those job seekers who relocate under the Connecting People with Jobs initiative. The Department does not capture data on job seekers who consider Connecting People with Jobs but decline to relocate.

(c) As at 30 November 2011, a total of 251 job seekers have relocated, and (d) a total of \$523,290 spent, under the Connecting People with Jobs initiative.
