SENATE ESTIMATES QUESTION ON NOTICE No. 1

Senator Boswell asked the Minister representing the Minister for Defence Science and Personnel, upon notice, on 21 October 2008:

What if any steps have been taken to estimate the costs of the government's response to climate change including the Carbon Pollution Reduction Scheme for every department, agency and program within this portfolio?

What are the costs and estimated costs identified (reported separately)?

Have any costs been included in forward estimates and if so where?

Senator Faulkner - The Minister for Defence Science and Personnel has provided the following answer to the honourable senator's question:

(1) Defence Housing Australia has not costed the Government's response to climate change including the Carbon Pollution Reduction Scheme. Advice on the applicability of the *National Greenhouse and Energy Reporting Act 2007* to Defence Housing Australia is inconclusive. Nonetheless, there are likely to be a range of indirect and direct impacts on the Australian construction industry including increasing the costs of construction. These impacts have not been identified and costed by Defence Housing Australia or the wider residential housing sector at this time. However, it is likely that the purchasing of supplies and materials, and the increases in energy prices will make the cost of construction more expensive. No costs have been included in forward estimates.

The growth in the amount of rent assistance paid to MWD over the period is 7.5% per year based on the average cost per member in 2003-04 (\$9,617) compared to the average cost per member in 2007-08 (\$12,513). The actual amount of rent assistance paid to any one member is determined by rank and location.

The additional 1900 units (approx) of housing stock required by DHA is in response to Defences increased housing requirements and to achieve a Defence target of 15% Rental Assistance.
