Question: (Senator Birmingham)

- 1. How much of the \$489 million Solar Schools Plan promised by Rudd Labor at the 2007 election has been allocated and expended? Please provide a breakdown of expenditure by electorate?
- 2. How many schools have fully expended their \$20,000 allocation for solar technology?
- 3. How many schools are now fully 'solar schools'?
- 4. How many schools have fully expended their \$30,000 allocation for energy and water efficiency projects?

Answer:

1. As at 23 May 2010, funding totalling \$69.8 million had been paid to 1,366 schools through individual claims since the program commenced on 1 July 2008.

A breakdown of this expenditure by electorate is provided in the table below.

In addition, funding totalling \$40.2 million has been allocated to the States under cooperative delivery arrangements to install eligible items in 1,128 government schools. Final details and costs of the items being installed in these schools will be provided by each of the relevant State agencies as part of their final reporting and financial acquittal obligations under individual State funding agreements. Details for most of these 1,128 schools are not required until after 30 June 2010.

- 2. Schools that elect to install a 2 kilowatt or greater capacity solar power system are entitled to apply for a maximum of \$50,000. Schools may choose to spend all or some of this on solar power systems. Of the 1,366 individual schools so far funded through individual claims, 1,293 have installed solar power systems.
- 3. See response to 2.
- 4. Schools that elect not to install a 2 kilowatt or greater solar power system are eligible to apply for a maximum of \$30,000 to install any eligible measures, including energy efficiency measures and rainwater tanks. Eighty-five schools have so far submitted claims for \$30,000 or less. Of these schools, 68 have chosen not to install a solar power system but have installed rainwater tanks and/or energy efficient items.
