## **Question No. 17**

## Senator Humphries asked the following question at the hearing of 22 February 2011:

On 22 January, the Human Services Minister announced a taskforce to investigate people rorting Centrelink payments provided following the Queensland and Victorian floods.

It is a cross agency taskforce including people from the AFP, ACC, the tax office and AUSTRAC and is being led by Centrelink.

- 1. How many AFP staff are working on this taskforce?
- 2. Where are these staff based?

## The answer to the honourable Senator's question is as follows:

- 1. The AFP has six agents outposted to Centrelink. These agents provide advice and support to Centrelink on a range of matters relevant to law enforcement, including matters related to this taskforce if required. The AFP is not a permanent part of the taskforce.
- 2. AFP agents are attached to Centrelink Offices in New South Wales, Victoria, South Australia and Queensland. AFP recently agreed to a further three outposted agents to be located in New South Wales, Victoria and ACT.
