- 1. The Commonwealth Government developed an issues paper, A Commonwealth Statutory Cause of Action for Serious Invasion of Privacy, to inform its response to the Australian Law Reform Commission's recommendations to introduce a statutory cause of action for serious invasions of privacy (this was also post the News of the World scandal)
 - (a) What is the status of the Government's proposed Statutory Cause of Action for Serious Invasion of Privacy?

 - (c) Have you made contact with any of the submitters to have them elaborate on their view?
 - (d) When will a report be presented to Parliament?
