Senator Hanson-Young (L&CA 59) asked:

How many asylum seekers have been resettled from the areas bordering Afghanistan? Which areas have they come from? Provide a split of the numbers of people who have come under the special humanitarian program and the refugee program.

Answer:

During the 2011-12 program year 657 humanitarian visas were granted to persons in Pakistan and Iran. Table 1 provides a breakdown by location and visa category.
