I was paid \$11-000 while my brother was paid \$14-000. This amount was nothing but an insult to both of us given we both got a life sentence and hardships throughout our life. I was also bashed senseless by a teacher in the boys home on a daily basis named Bradley Allen. The beatings were common pratice by staff and being locked in a tin shed for hours was another form of punishment. The whole thing has never been told for fear of reprisals and not being believed. I lost a good friend that was abused through suicide as he could no longer go on with the memories. There is much more to say about all this

we had a motto in the boys home and pardon its crudeness but it was The salvo,s with a bible in one hand and a kids dick in the other. We often hear of the stolen generation, what about the abused generation?
