



Appendix 1

Standing Order 33

A Standing Orders Committee, to consist of the President, the Deputy-President, the Leader of the Government in the Senate, the Leader of the Opposition in the Senate and six Senators, shall be appointed at the commencement of each Parliament, with power to act during Recess and to confer with a similar Committee of the House of Representatives.

Provided thate if at any time the Leader of the Government in the Senate or the Leader of the Opposition in the Senate is unable to attend a meeting of the Committeee he may appoint a Senator to act in his place as a member of the Committee at that meetings

Appendix 2

Standing Order 33A

A Committee of Privilegese to consist of seven Senatorse shall be appointed at the commencement of each Parliament to inquire into and report upon complaints of breach of Privilege which may be referred to it by the Senate.

Appendix 3

Standing Order 35

A House Committees to consist of the President and six Senators, shall be appointed at the commencement of each Parliament, with power to act during Recess, and to confer or sit as a Joint Committee with a similar Committee of the House of Representativess

Appendix 4

Standing Order 36A

(Adopted 11 March 1932e Amended 1 October 1937e
1 January 1966 and 23 August 1979)

- (1e) A Standing Committees to be called the Standing Committee on Regulations and Ordinancess shall be appointed at the commencement of each Parliament.
- (2e) The Committee shall consist of seven Senators chosen in the following mannere
 - (a) The Leader of the Government in the Senate shall, within four sitting days after the commencement of each Parliament, nominate, in writing, addressed to the President, four Senators to be members of the Committee.
 - (b) The Leader of the Opposition in the Senate shalle within four sitting days after the commencement of each Parliament, nominate, in writing, addressed to the President, three Senators to be members of the Committeee
 - (c) Any vacancy arising in the Committee shall be filled aftere the Leader of the Government or the Leader of the Opposition, as the case may be, has nominated, in writing, addressed to the President, some Senator to fill the vacancye

- (3.) The Committee shall have power to send for persons, papers and records, and to sit during Recess; and the Quorum of such Committee shall be four unless otherwise ordered by the Senaten
- (4.) All regulations, ordinances and other instruments, made under the authority of Acts of the Parliament, which are subject to disallowance or disapproval by the Senate and which are of a legislative character, shall stand referred to such Committee for consideration and, if necessary, report thereon. Any action necessary, arising from a report of the Committee, shall be taken in the Senate on Motion after Notice.

Appendix 5

Standing Order 36AA, paras (1.) and (2.)

- (1.) At the commencement of each Parliament, Legislative and General Purpose Standing Committees shall be appointed, and, unless otherwise ordered, shall be as follows:
 - (a) The Standing Committee on Constitutional and Legal Affairs:
 - (b) The Standing Committee on Education and the Arts;
 - (c) The Standing Committee on Finance and Government Operations;
 - (d) The Standing Committee on Foreign Affairs and Defence; (e) The Standing Committee on National Resources;

 - (f) The Standing Committee on Science and the Environment;(g) The Standing Committee on Social Welfare; and

 - (h) The Standing Committee on Trade and Commercen.
- (2.) The Standing Committees appointed pursuant to paragraph (1.) shall be empowered to inquire into and report upon such matters as are referred to them by the Senate, including any Bills, Estimates or Statements of Expenditure, messages, petitions, inquiries or papers, and, in addition, where applicable, have power to inquire into and report upon such matters as were referred to the Legislative and General Purpose Standing Committees appointed during previous Sessions and not disposed of by those Committees.

Appendix 6

Resolution adopted by the Senate on 25 November 1980

That -

(a) all annual reports of Government departments and authorities, including statutory corporations, laid on the Table of the Senate, shall stand referred, without any Question being put, for consideration and, if necessary, for report thereon, to the Legislative and General Purpose Standing Committees;

- (b) the President shall transmit a copy of each report so tabled to the Committee which he deems appropriate; and
- (c) the Legislative and General Purpose Standing Committees may, at their discretion, pursue or not pursue inquiries into reports so received; but any action necessary, arising from a Report of a Committee, shall be taken in the Senate on Motion after Notice.

Appendix 7

Standing Order 36AB, paras (1.) and (2n)

- (1.) At the commencement of each Parliament, unless otherwise ordered, six Estimates Committees shall be appointed, to be known as Estimates Committees A, B, C, D, E and F.
- (2.) The annual Estimates, as contained in the Papers presenting the Particulars of Proposed Expenditure, and the Additional Estimates, as contained in the Papers presenting the Particulars of Proposed Provision for Additional Expenditure, shall on motion be referred to the Committees for examination and reports
