NAB and ASIC to appear at Sydney hearing to discuss competition in banking

The House of Representatives Economics Committee will be holding a public hearing in Sydney on Friday 19 September as part of a federal parliamentary inquiry into competition in the banking and non-banking sectors in Australia.

The National Australia Bank and Members Equity Bank will have the opportunity to discuss with the House Economics Committee how they are managing the current environment and what steps they are taking to provide competitive services to their customers. The Australian Securities and Investments Commission and the Australian Competition and Consumer Commission will give their perspective on account portability and financial literacy.

Committee Chair, **Craig Thomson, (Member for Dobell, NSW)** said: "the Committee will investigate the extent to which competition in the financial sector has reduced and, in particular, examine proposals that could help to increase competition and reduce fees and charges for people struggling with their mortgages."
