MINERAL RESOURCE RENT TAX BILL 2011 AND RELATED BILLS PUBLIC HEARINGS IN CANBERRA Tuesday, 8 and Wednesday, 9 November 2011

The House Economics Committee will hold public hearings on the Mineral Resource Rent Tax Bill 2011 and related bills on Tuesday, 8 and Wednesday, 9 November 2011 in Committee Room 2R1, Parliament House, Canberra. The Bills implement the government's decision to lock in the benefits of the mining boom and deliver a fairer return from the nation's mineral wealth.

The Explanatory Memorandum explains that the 'Minerals Resource Rent Tax (MRRT) is a tax on the economic rents miners make from the taxable resources (iron ore, coal and some gases) after they are extracted from the ground but before they undergo any significant processing or value add.'

The revenue from the MRRT will deliver benefits for both business and workers. Businesses, both large and small, will benefit from a cut in the company tax rate. In addition, the package of reform will increase the small business instant asset write-off threshold from \$1 000 to \$6 500. Working people will benefit from changes to superannuation which will provide an increase to the superannuation savings of 8.4 million workers. The legislation will gradually increase the superannuation guarantee charge percentage from 9 per cent to 12 per cent.
