Subject: Implementation Procedures for Airworthiness Covering Design Approval, Production Activities, Export Airworthiness Approval, Post Design Approval Activities, and Technical Assistance Between Authorities under the Agreement on the Promotion of Aviation Safety Between the Government of Australia and the Government of the United States of America

I am writing in relation to the Joint Standing Committee on Treaties inquiry into amendments to the Implementation Procedures for Airworthiness [2010] ATNIF 30 under the Agreement on the Promotion of Aviation Safety between the Government of Australia and the Government of the United States of America that was referred on 16 November 2010.

At its hearing on 25 February 2011, the Committee sought information on the size of the market for the export of aircraft manufacturing products from Australia to the United States of America and from the United States of America to Australia.

According to information provided by the Australian Bureau of Statistics and incorporated into Table 1 of the Regulatory Impact Statement on the amendments to the Implementation Procedures for Airworthiness, the value of aircraft manufacturing exports to the United States from Australia and imports from the United States to Australia in Australian dollars for 2008/09 was as follows:

The Committee also sought advice about trade tariffs or other barriers which could affect the price competiveness of Australian products in the United States and vice-versa.
