Welcome to Canberra and to Canberra's public transport system, ACTION. ACTION's bus network operates every day of the year and has services that can take you where you want to go, quickly and easily!

How to use ACTION

ACTION's services are based around the four town centre interchanges - City, Woden, Tuggeranong and Belconnen. You can catch a bus from an interchange or from any stop along the bus route by signalling the driver. When you wish to get off the bus, press the bell (on the poles inside the bus) to let the driver know you want the bus to stop. Please not that the rear doors only open at interchanges.

Fares

Canberra is divided up into three zones - North, South and Central. The zone boundaries border Woden and Belconnen Town Centres. To avoid trying to work out which zone ticket you need, we recommend our Daily Ticket, which you can buy from any bus driver as you board the bus. The Daily Ticket provides you with unlimited travel on any of ACTION services for one day. The adult daily ticket costs \$8.40, and the child or concession daily ticket costs \$4.20.
