Statement by Minister

The Minister for Regional Services, Territories and Local Government <u>made a statement</u> indicating that the Government was unable to table the correspondence, reports, investigations and any other information and documentation from the Federal Office of Road Safety in relation to certain matters (agreed to by the Senate on 5 October 2000) by the due date. The Minister advised that the documents would be tabled as soon as practicable.

Question on notice-failure to provide answer

Senator O'Brien asked the Leader of the Government in the Senate for an explanation for answers not being provided to 92 questions on notice asked of ministers. The minister indicated that answers would be provided.
