<u>Letters of advice</u> for various portfolios were tabled [Lists of all grants approved are <u>required to be tabled</u> 7 days before the commencement of budget, supplementary budget and additional estimates hearings]

Ministerial statement

The Minister for Finance (Senator Cormann) tabled a <u>ministerial statement</u> about the International Day of Zero Tolerance to Female Genital Mutilation
