The Senate met from 10 am until 10.28 pm

The following bills were debated

Clean Energy Legislation (Carbon Tax Repeal) Bill 2013 and 8 related bills—second reading agreed to [first speaker]—1 Australian Greens second reading amendment negatived; 1 Opposition second reading amendment was agreed to [expressing views about the policy of the bill]—committee of the whole commenced—Opposition amendments nos 1, 2 and 3 to be determined [further amendments remain to be considered]

Private senators' bills to be debated

On 14 November 2013 the Senate agreed to a temporary order allowing private senators' bills to be considered on Thursdays. On 20 March 2014 the Defence Legislation Amendment (Woomera Prohibited Area) Bill 2013 and the National Broadband Network Companies Amendment (Tasmania) Bill 2014 are scheduled for debate
