- the Minister representing the Minister for Industry, Innovation and Science to table <u>documents</u> relating to the restructuring of the CSIRO Oceans and Atmosphere division—no later than 9 am on 3 March 2016 [a statement was made]

Senator Canavan provided a <u>response</u>. A motion moved by Senator Ludlam to take note of the response was debated and agreed to [<u>first speaker</u>]
