Proposed suspension of standing orders

The Senate did not agree to a <u>motion</u> moved by the Leader of the Opposition in the Senate (Senator Wong) to suspend standing orders to enable debate on a motion to vary the order of business [<u>first speaker</u>]

Question on notice–Answer and explanation

Senator Brown <u>asked</u> the Minister representing the Minister for Social Services (Senator Fifield) for an explanation of an answer not being provided to a question placed on notice relating to the paid parental leave. Senator Fifield provided a <u>response</u>. A motion moved by Senator Brown to take note of the response was debated and agreed to [first speaker]
