The Senate met from 9.30 am until 10.20 pm

The Governor-General, His Excellency General the Honourable Sir Peter Cosgrove, AK MC (Retd), <u>opened</u> the second session of the 44th Parliament, and addressed the members of both houses in the Senate chamber

The Senate agreed that the speech will be debated and an address-in-reply agreed to. Debate commenced on the address-in-reply to the <u>Governor-General's opening speech</u> [first speaker]
