

QUICK GUIDE: RESOURCES, ENERGY AND MANUFACTURING

JAPEA will deliver tariff-free entry for Australia's key resources, energy and manufactured exports.

In 2013, Australia exported over \$42 billion worth of resources, energy and manufactured products to Japan. On entry into force of JAPEA, 99.7 per cent of Japan's imports of these products from Australia will enter Japan duty free. On full implementation of JAPEA all of Australia's current resources, energy and manufacturing exports will enter Japan duty-free.

Key outcomes include:

- Immediate elimination of tariffs on resources and energy products including **coke and semi coke** of coal (3.2 per cent) and non-crude **petroleum oils** (up to 7.9 per cent).
- Elimination of tariffs on transformed energy and mineral products such as **aluminium hydroxide** (3.3 per cent), **titanium dioxide** (3.2 per cent), unwrought **nickel** (11.7 per cent) and **ferro-manganese** (6.3 per cent), many on entry into force.
- Elimination of tariffs up to 12.8 per cent on key **apparel** products and more liberal rules of origin than Japan has ever applied to another country.
- Elimination of tariffs up to 6.5 per cent on **plastic products**, most immediately.
- Immediate elimination of tariffs on **wood products** (up to 7.5 per cent), **paints** (4 per cent), **pearl jewellery** (5.2 per cent) and **shaving creams and deodorants** (up to 4.8 per cent).

Australia will continue to enjoy tariff free access for automotive parts, pharmaceuticals and vitamins, medical instruments and apparatus, paper, sheepskins and cow hides as well as all large resource exports including iron ore, coal and LNG.
