Appendix 1

Standing Order 33

A Standing Orders Committee, to consist of the President and Chairman of Committees and eight Senators, shall be appointed at the commencement of each Parliament, with power to act during Recess and to confer with a similar Committee of the House of Representatives.

Appendix 2

Standing Order 33A

A Committee of Privileges, to consist of seven Senators, shall be appointed at the commencement of each Parliament to inquire into and report upon complaints of breach of Privilege which may be referred to it by the Senate.

Appendix 3

Standing Order 36A

(Adopted 11 March 1932. Amended 1 October 1937, 1 January 1966 and 23 August 1979)

(1.) A Standing Committee, to be called the Standing Committee on Regulations and Ordinances, shall be appointed at the commencement of each Parliament.

(2.) The Committee shall consist of seven Senators chosen in the following manner:

- (a) The Leader of the Government in the Senate shall, within four sitting days after the commencement of each Parliament, nominate, in writing, addressed to the President, four Senators to be members of the Committee.
- (b) The Leader of the Opposition in the Senate shall, within four sitting days after the commencement of each Parliament, nominate, in writing, addressed to the President, three Senators to be members of the Committee.
- (c) Any vacancy arising in the Committee shall be filled after the Leader of the Government or the Leader of the Opposition, as the case may be, has nominated, in writing, addressed to the President, some Senator to fill the vacancy.

(3.) The Committee shall have power to send for persons, papers and records, and to sit during Recess; and the Quorum of such Committee shall be four unless otherwise ordered by the Senate.

(4.) All regulations, ordinances and other instruments, made under the authority of Acts of the Parliament, which are subject to disallowance or disapproval by the Senate and which are of a legislative character, shall stand referred to such Committee for consideration and, if necessary, report thereon. Any action necessary, arising from a report of the Committee, shall be taken in the Senate on Motion after Notice.

Appendix 4

Standing Order 36AA, paras (1.) and (2.)

(1.) At the commencement of each Parliament, Legislative and General Purpose Standing Committees shall be appointed, and, Inless otherwise ordered, shall be as follows:

(a) The Standing Committee on Constitutional and Legal Affairs;
(b) The Standing Committee on Education and the Arts;
(c) The Standing Committee on Finance and Government Operations;
(d) The Standing Committee on Foreign Affairs and Defence;
(e) The Standing Committee on National Resources;
(f) The Standing Committee on Science and the Environment;
(g) The Standing Committee on Social Welfare; and
(h) The Standing Committee on Trade and Commerce.

(2.) The Standing Committees appointed pursuant to paragraph /1.) shall be empowered to inquire into and report upon such ratters as are referred to them by the Senate, including any Bills, Estimates or Statements of Expenditure, messages, petitions, inquiries or papers, and, in addition, where applicable, have power to inquire into and report upon such matters as were referred to the Legislative and General Purpose Standing Committees appointed during previous Sessions and not disposed of by those Committees.

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Appendix 5

Resolution adopted by the Senate on <u>26 November 1980</u>

That -

 (a) all annual reports of Government departments and authorities, including statutory corporations, laid on the Table of the Senate, shall stand referred, without any Question being put, for consideration and, if necessary, for report thereon, to the Legislative and General Purpose Standing Committees;

- (b) the President shall transmit a copy of each report so tabled to the Committee which he deems appropriate; and
- (c) the Legislative and General Purpose Standing Committees may, at their discretion, pursue or not pursue inquiries into reports so received; but any action necessary, arising from a Report of a Committee, shall be taken in the Senate on Motion after Notice.

Appendix 6

Standing Order 36AB, paras (1.) and (2.)

(1.) At the commencement of each Parliament, unless otherwise ordered, six Estimates Committees shall be appointed, to be known as Estimates Committees A, B, C, D, E and F.

(2.) The annual Estimates, as contained in the Papers presenting the Particulars of Proposed Expenditure, and the Additional Estimates, as contained in the Papers presenting the Particulars of Proposed Provision for Additional Expenditure, shall on motion be referred to the Committees for examination and report.

NOTE: By Resolution of the Senate, eight Estimates Committees are established at present.

Resolution referring Departmental Expenditure under Advance to the Minister for Finance to Estimates Committees

Pursuant to the Resolution of the Senate on 16 November 1978, departmental expenditure under the Advance to the Minister for Finance ... be referred to the Estimates Committees for examination and report prior to consideration in Committee of the whole.

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

Stage reached in current inquiries and future program

During the Budget Sittings, the Committee completed a program of activity resulting in the tabling of two reports and continued with its major reference on the legal feasibility of a Makarrata.

The Committee completed its Report on Annual Reports and tabled it on 23 September 1982. This report reviewed the annual reports for 1979-80 and 1981-82 of seventeen agencies, whose activities had been referred by the Senate to the Committee for scrutiny.

A report by the Committee, entitled 'The Burden of Proof in Criminal Proceedings', which deals with the reversal of the burden of proof in Commonwealth legislation, was tabled on 25 November 1982. Considering the highly technical nature of much of its content, the report has aroused considerable public interest.

The Committee has concluded its public hearings on the Makarrata reference, and drafting of the report on this reference is under way.

The Committee's work on its oversight function with respect to implementation of Law Reform Commission reports has until now been restricted by its workload in other areas. However, preliminary work on the matter is under way.

The Senate Finance and Government Operations Committee has a continuing reference on the 'oversight of financial and administrative affairs ... of Commonwealth statutory authorities'. The Committee has to date issued six Reports on the subject of QANGO's as they are perhaps better known.

The theme of the Committee's reports has been accountability and disclosure to the Parliament of authority activities. The Committee recently tabled its Fifth Report which contains measures designed to enhance the flow of information to the Parliament of authority activities. The Committee is also undertaking a detailed economic survey of ten of the largest commercial authorities. This work will complement the Committee's earlier survey of all Commonwealth statutory authorities which revealed the size and influence of authorities on the economy. As part of the current survey the Committee is also looking at the funding of superannuation by authorities and the possible effect the recommendations contained in the Campbell Committee report on the Australian Financial System may have on authority borrowing programs. The Committee is particularly concerned at possible effects on interest rate levels given the significance of borrowings and the amount of debt that has to be refinanced. A report on these issues can be expected in the New Year.

The Committee will continue its case study approach to the investigation of authorities and the examination of annual reports which select themselves by virtue of late presentation or audit qualifications.

Australian Fishing Industry - On 20 November 1979 the Senate resolved that the Committee inquire into and report on the Commonwealth's responsibility for the development of the Australian fishing industry. The inquiry was advertised in the national press and fishing journals in March 1980 inviting submissions on this matter. The Committee received over 70 submissions as well as a large volume of supporting material. The first public hearing was held in Canberra in March 1981. Eighteen subsequent public hearings were held in all States, the Northern Territory and Canberra. As part of the inquiry, the Committee also undertook an extensive series of inspections visiting fishing centres throughout Australia and holding informal discussions with representatives of industry and government in these areas. The inquiry was completed in November 1982. In accordance with the resolution of the Senate passed on 16 December 1982, the Committee's report on this matter was expected to be presented to the President in January 1983.

Export Coal Industry - This matter was referred to the Committee by the Senate on 23 May 1980. In March 1981, advertisements were placed in the national press and industry journals inviting interested persons and organisations to present written submissions to the Committee. During May 1982, the Committee visited coalfields and coal handling facilities in Queensland and held informal discussions with various industry groups in that State. The Committee visited coalfields and coal loading facilities in New South Wales from 31 August to 2 September.

The first public hearing for the export coal inquiry was held in Canberra on 14 October; officers of the Commonwealth Department of Trade and Resources appeared before the Committee. A further public hearing was held on 21 October at which evidence was taken from officers of the Department of Transport and Construction. The Committee's program of public hearings for the inquiry continued during November when public hearings were held in Brisbane and Sydney on 2 and 3 November respectively. Further public hearings are being planned for Melbourne, Sydney and Canberra early in 1983. The Committee also proposed visiting coal loading facilities in Port Kembla and holding informal discussions in Wollongong during this period.

Inquiry program

The Committee decided to conduct its inquiry in two parts and to undertake the inquiry on the Ordnance Factory at Bendigo first. The report on the 'Future of Ordnance Factory Bendigo' was tabled on 9 March 1982 and a ministerial response to the report was tabled in the Senate on 24 August 1982.

Inquiry Program

The Senate Select Committee on Industrial Relations Legislation was established when the Senate, on 5 May 1982, at the second reading stage of consideration of the Conciliation and Arbitration Amendment Bill 1982 and the Commonwealth Employees (Voluntary Membership of Unions) Bill 1982, decided to send the Bills to a Select Committee for inquiry and report by the first sitting day in September 1982. On 8 September the Senate granted the Committee an extension of time to present a final Report by 26 October 1982.

In referring the Bills, the Senate also asked the Committee to give particular consideration to:

- (i) the desirability or otherwise of encouraging the development of industry-based unions in Australia, and the best methods of providing changes in the structure of Australian Trade Union organisation,
- (ii) whether the provisions of 'voluntary unionism' and the removal of power to award preference to unionists will contribute to industrial peace and an improvement of the industrial relations climate, and
- (iii) whether the right of employers to stand down employees as a result of industrial action without reference to the Conciliation and Arbitration Commission is consistent with modern industrial practices, and will contribute to industrial peace.

The Committee received seventy-one submissions from employer organisations, the ACTU, unions, Government Departments and authorities and private individuals. The Committee held five public hearings in Sydney, Melbourne and Canberra.

The Committee presented an interim report to the Senate on 7 September 1982 and its final report was presented on 26 October 1982.

Stage reached in inquiry and future program

The Committee held public hearings in Melbourne (12, 13 May), Canberra (17, 21 May), Adelaide (15 June), Perth (16 June), Sydney (1, 2 July), Brisbane (15 October), Melbourne (18 October) and Hobart (29 October). Further public hearings were held in Sydney on 1 and 2 November and in Canberra on 23 November. This concluded the program of public hearings for the inquiry.

Stage reached in inquiry and future program

After having received 746 submissions and considerable published material and held 18 days of public hearings, the Committee presented its first report to the Senate on 23 November 1982. The report covered the demand for and supply of electricity for Tasmania, the significance of the archaeological discoveries near the Franklin River the Commonwealth's obligations and powers in relation to South West Tasmania.

The Committee is now considering the natural values of South West Tasmania and the environmental effects of the various supply options. A sub-committee of the Committee, consisting of Senators Archer, Coates and Primmer, is also examining the effects of other land uses, such as mining, forestry, tourism and recreation, on the preservation of Tasmania's wilderness areas of national and international importance.

The Committee is planning to hold further public hearings in Tasmania and in Canberra during February 1983 and is expecting to present its second report to the Senate in April 1983.

Appendix 1

Standing Order 33

A Standing Orders Committee, to consist of the President and Chairman of Committees and eight Senators, shall be appointed at the commencement of each Parliament, with power to act during Recess and to confer with a similar Committee of the House of Representatives.

Appendix 2

Standing Order 33A

A Committee of Privileges, to consist of seven Senators, shall be appointed at the commencement of each Parliament to inquire into and report upon complaints of breach of Privilege which may be referred to it by the Senate.

Appendix 3

Standing Order 36A

(Adopted 11 March 1932. Amended 1 October 1937, 1 January 1966 and 23 August 1979)

(1.) A Standing Committee, to be called the Standing Committee on Regulations and Ordinances, shall be appointed at the commencement of each Parliament.

(2.) The Committee shall consist of seven Senators chosen in the following manner:

- (a) The Leader of the Government in the Senate shall, within four sitting days after the commencement of each Parliament, nominate, in writing, addressed to the President, four Senators to be members of the Committee.
- (b) The Leader of the Opposition in the Senate shall, within four sitting days after the commencement of each Parliament, nominate, in writing, addressed to the President, three Senators to be members of the Committee.
- (c) Any vacancy arising in the Committee shall be filled after the Leader of the Government or the Leader of the Opposition, as the case may be, has nominated, in writing, addressed to the President, some Senator to fill the vacancy.

(3.) The Committee shall have power to send for persons, papers and records, and to sit during Recess; and the Quorum of such Committee shall be four unless otherwise ordered by the Senate.

(4.) All regulations, ordinances and other instruments, made under the authority of Acts of the Parliament, which are subject to disallowance or disapproval by the Senate and which are of a legislative character, shall stand referred to such Committee for consideration and, if necessary, report thereon. Any action necessary, arising from a report of the Committee, shall be taken in the Senate on Motion after Notice.

Appendix 4

Standing Order 36AA, paras (1.) and (2.)

(1.) At the commencement of each Parliament, Legislative and General Purpose Standing Committees shall be appointed, and, unless otherwise ordered, shall be as follows:

- (a) The Standing Committee on Constitutional and Legal Affairs;
- (b) The Standing Committee on Education and the Arts;
- (c) The Standing Committee on Finance and Government Operations;
- (d) The Standing Committee on Foreign Affairs and Defence;
- (e) The Standing Committee on National Resources;
- (f) The Standing Committee on Science and the Environment;
- (g) The Standing Committee on Social Welfare; and
- (h) The Standing Committee on Trade and Commerce.

(2.) The Standing Committees appointed pursuant to paragraph (1.) shall be empowered to inquire into and report upon such matters as are referred to them by the Senate, including any Bills, Estimates or Statements of Expenditure, messages, petitions, inquiries or papers, and, in addition, where applicable, have power to inquire into and report upon such matters as were referred to the Legislative and General Purpose Standing Committees appointed during previous Sessions and not disposed of by those Committees.

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Appendix 5

Resolution adopted by the Senate on 26 November 1980

That -

- (a) all annual reports of Government departments and authorities, including statutory corporations, laid on the Table of the Senate, shall stand referred, without any Question being put, for consideration and, if necessary, for report thereon, to the Legislative and General Purpose Standing Committees;
- (b) the President shall transmit a copy of each report so tabled to the Committee which he deems appropriate; and
- (c) the Legislative and General Purpose Standing Committees may, at their discretion, pursue or not pursue inquiries into reports so received; but any action necessary, arising from a Report of a Committee, shall be taken in the Senate on Motion after Notice.

Appendix 6

Standing Order 36AB, paras (1.) and (2.)

(1.) At the commencement of each Parliament, unless otherwise ordered, six Estimates Committees shall be appointed, to be known as Estimates Committees A, B, C, D, E, and F.

(2.) The annual Estimates, as contained in the Papers presenting the Particulars of Proposed Expenditure, and the Additional Estimates, as contained in the Papers presenting the Particulars of Proposed Provision for Additional Expenditure, shall on motion be referred to the Committees for examination and report.

NOTE: By Resolution of the Senate, eight Estimates Committees are established at present.

Appendix 7

Resolution referring Departmental Expenditure under Advance to the Minister for Finance to Estimates Committees
