#### Section 3(d)

Please list the steps you have taken to assure yourself you have not acquired citizenship of another country by descent, marriage or other means.

I could not have inherited citizenship of another country from my maternal grandparents or my paternal grandfather.

I conducted legal research and received legal advice from German and Australian lawyers to ensure that I did not inherit German citizenship from my paternal grandmother.

I have not inherited German citizenship from her.

There are at least three independent reasons why I did not. By that I mean each of the reasons, on its own, is a complete answer to why I don't hold German citizenship

First, under the German law in force when my paternal grandparents got married in 1940 in Australia, my paternal grandmother lost her German citizenship when she married my grandfather, a non-German. Under Australian law in force at the time she took my grandfather's citizenship when they got married. Therefore, my grandmother was not a German citizen when my father was born in 1941 and he did not inherit German citizenship from his mother.

Second, even if my grandmother was a German citizen when my father was born in 1941 (which she was not), under German law in force at the time my father would have inherited the citizenship of his father and not his mother.

Therefore, neither my father nor I have ever held the status of German citizenship.

It is interesting to note, that even if the first two points did not exist there is a third reason why I would not have the status of German citizenship. As Jews my grandmother and father would have been stripped of German citizenship rights if they had held them when the Nazi laws came into force. After those Nazi laws were repealed, any descendants who were born overseas would need to apply for German citizenship. It was not automatically conferred on them by the laws brought in to reverse the Nazi laws. Even though for the first two reasons I would never have been eligible to apply for German citizenship, I confirm that I cannot apply and have never applied for it.
