Re Your Dutch nationality

Dear Mr Van Manen,

With reference to your request regarding possession of the Dutch nationality please be advised that the following seems to be applicable:

- As you were born on the 24th March 1965 in Australia from Dutch parents you automatically obtained Dutch nationality at birth under art 1a of the Dutch Nationality Act (WNI).
- As you were born in Australia it seems that you also automatically obtained Australian citizenship under art 10.1 of the Australian Nationality and Citizenship Act 1948.
- You declared that your parents never obtained Australian citizenship.
- You declared that you have not left Australia as an adult to live abroad for an indefinite period of time.
- You declared that you have not lost your Australian citizenship at any time.
- Under art 15c RWN (unofficially translated) 'a person who is of full age shall
 lose his or her Netherlands nationality if he or she also has a foreign
 nationality and, after coming of age and while possessing both nationalities,
 has his or her principal place of residence for a continuous period of ten
 years outside the Netherlands, the Netherlands Antilles and Aruba, in the
 country of that other nationality and in which he or she has been born,
 other than in the service of the Netherlands, the Netherlands Antilles or
 Aruba and/or of an international body at which
- The registry as mentioned under article 22 of the Dutch Nationality Act (RWN) doesn't contain any registration under your name of regaining Dutch nationality

Given the above you seem to have held both Dutch and Australian nationalities from birth and have not lost your Dutch nationality as a minor under the old Nationality Act (WNI). With the implementation of the new Dutch Nationality Act (RWN) on 1st of January 1985 however you became an adult and the effects of article 15c RWN were applicable from that day on. I therefor come to the

conclusion that you lost your Dutch nationality on the $1^{\rm st}$ of January 1995 under article 15c of the Dutch Nationality Act (RWN) and have not regained your Dutch nationality ever since.

As a former Dutch national and under the present Nationality Act (RWN) you cannot regain Dutch nationality within Australia. You may apply for Dutch nationality in the Netherlands through 'option' only after having legal residence within the Kingdom of at least one year.
