In response to your request regarding the subject issue, we communicate the following:

According to article 27 of the Greek Nationality Code (1.3284/2004) combined with article 1 of the Provisions Code for Male Registries (1.2119/1993), the acquisition of Greek nationality/citizenship is proven by the registration within the Municipal and Male Registries (cases of males) of the Greek State.

In the specific case and according to Protocol no 134/20.03.2019, and after investigation conducted by the Municipality of Megistis/Prefecture no such registration of BARBOUTTIS Fiona (daughter) of George Mark and Kathleen Ann, born in Australia on 16/11/1977 appeared in the Municipal Registries of Municipality Megistis Dodecanese Greece.

## Automatic acquisition of Danish citizenship

In certain situations, a person automatically receives Danish citizenship.

## Citizenship at birth

Children born on July 1, 2014 or later will automatically receive Danish citizenship at birth if the father, mother or co-mother is Danish.

In addition, found children who are found in Denmark are considered Danish citizens until otherwise stated.

The rules on automatic acquisition of Danish citizenship at birth for children born before 1 July 2014 have been changed regularly, and reference is made to applicable national legislation at the time of birth. Whether the child can obtain Danish citizenship may depend on which parent is a Danish citizen, whether the parents were married at the time of the child's birth, and whether the child was born in Denmark or abroad.

## Citizenship by parents' marriage

If a child of a Danish father and a foreign mother have not received Danish citizenship at birth, the child will receive Danish citizenship if the parents subsequently marry. However, it is a condition that the child at this time is under 18 and unmarried.

Children born outside of marriage of a foreign mother and a Danish father during the period from October 12, 1993 to June 30, 2014, may obtain Danish citizenship upon application. In these cases, the child must not fulfill the general conditions for obtaining Danish citizenship.

## Citizenship by adoption

#### Adoption conducted in accordance with Danish law

A foreign child under the age of 12 adopted by a Danish adoption permit becomes a Danish citizen when adopted, if the child is adopted by a married couple or a cohabiting couple, where at least one of

the spouses or the cohabiting partner is a Danish citizen, or by a single Danish citizen.

The same applies if the child is adopted by a foreign decision which is recognized pursuant to section 28 (2) of the Adoption Act. 2. Section 28 (2) of the Adoption Act. 2 deals with adoptions carried out according to Danish law by a child from abroad, but in cases covered by section 28 (2). 2, no Danish adoption permit is made, as there is instead a foreign adoption decision recognized in Denmark. The provision concerns foreign adoption decisions in this country when the adoption has been carried out with a view to adoption of the child to Denmark.

In connection with the completion of a Danish implemented adoption, the Family Court House issues either a Danish adoption permit or a confirmation that the foreign adoption decision is recognized immediately.

The rules on citizenship in connection with adoption are stated in section 2 A, of the Nationality Act.

#### Adoption conducted by foreign law

If an adoption has not been carried out according to Danish law / via the Danish authorities (that is, if the applicants have adopted abroad under foreign law), the adoption is not covered by section 28 (2) of the Adoption Act. 2. In these situations, the adoption is not necessarily valid in Denmark.

The Family Court House can assess whether such a foreign adoption can be recognized under Danish law and thus become valid in Denmark. There are various conditions that must be met in order for a foreign adoption to be recognized according to Danish law - for example, the adoptive must have a domicile, ie permanent and permanent residence in the country that is adopted.

The Family Court House prepares an opinion to the authority or citizen who has requested an assessment of whether a completed foreign adoption can be recognized after Danish family law and thus become valid in Denmark.

An adoption abroad, which is carried out according to foreign law, is not covered by Section 2 A. of the Nationality Act.

If a child does not automatically receive Danish citizenship upon adoption, the child may apply to become a Danish citizen.

## Documentation for the acquisition of Danish citizenship and for kinship

Proof of automatic acquisition of Danish citizenship at birth or at the parents' subsequent conclusion of marriage presupposes that the Danish parent's nationality is documented and that the relationship with the child is documented, typically by presenting birth certificates. If the Danish parent has obtained Danish citizenship in some other way than at birth or the parents' marriage, then this must be documented.

In cases where the parents' marriage is decisive for the child to have Danish citizenship, this must also be documented, typically by presenting the marriage certificate.

Foreign documents can as a rule be used as documentation for kinship and / or marriage.
