Response to Question 10b

I was born and raised by my uncle (my mother's brother) and other extended family members, in Sydney. I am an Australian citizen by birth by virtue of section 10(2)(b) of the *Australian Citizenship Act 1948*.

I could not have obtained citizenship of Papua New Guinea at birth through my biological father, who is not recorded on my birth certificate, including because my birth was never registered with the Papua New Guinean authorities in accordance with Papua New Guinean nationality law.

I was not included in my mother's application for Papua New Guinean citizenship, which was lodged after I was born and while I was living in Australia with my extended family, and so I did not become a citizen of Papua New Guinea through my mother.

Under Sri Lankan nationality law, a person born overseas to a Sri Lankan parent does not become a citizen of Sri Lanka unless his or her birth is registered with the Government of Sri Lanka. My birth was never registered with the Government of Sri Lanka. Accordingly, I never acquired citizenship of Sri Lanka.

Even if I had acquired PNG or Sri Lankan citizenship as a minor, I would have ceased to be a citizen of either country by operation of Papua New Guinean or Sri Lankan citizenship law, as applicable (noting that both countries require a person to take active steps to maintain dual citizenship shortly after the person becomes an adult, which I have not done).

Even if I had been formally adopted by my Malaysian step-father, which I wasn't, this would not automatically make me a citizen of Malaysia.

I have never taken any steps to acquire Papua New Guinean, Sri Lankan or Malaysian citizenship and no steps have been taken on my behalf.

I have obtained legal advice confirming I am not a citizen of Sri Lanka, Papua New Guinea or Malaysia.
